

Next Weekend, at all Masses there will be a <u>Second Collection for Church Missions within the United States</u>. This collection is combined with <u>Black and Indian Missions and Catholic Home Missions Appeal.</u>

<u>Black and Indian Missions</u>— for evangelizing the Black and Indian peoples of the United States. The funds are distributed as grants to dioceses throughout the United States, supporting and strengthening evangelization programs which otherwise would cease. The Collection was formerly know as the Black and Indian Home Mission Collection.

<u>Catholic Home Missions Appeal</u>— the Appeal strengthens the Catholic Church in the United States and its territories in 85 Latin and Eastern Catholic dioceses. The Subcommittee on the Catholic Home Missions funds a wide range of pastoral services, including evangelization, religious education, and the maintenance of mission parishes, the training of seminarians and lay ministers, and ministry with ethnic groups.
