

Lenten Guidelines for Mass:

Violet is the liturgical color of Lent. The Fourth Sunday of Lent is Laetare Sunday; rose vestments may be worn.

Flowers are not permitted, except on Laetare Sunday. These should be in moderation.

The Gloria is omitted during the season of Lent, except on the Solemnity of Saint Joseph (March 20) and the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord (March 25).

The Alleluia is not permitted to be said or sung during Lent. Refrain from choosing hymns that contain the word Alleluia.

The origins of Lent can be traced to the Council of Nicea in 325. The earliest observances of Lent were focused on fasting. We can find the roots of Lent with eleven terrified apostles hiding in an Upper Room. Hunted by both the religious authorities, as well as Rome, as the prime suspects of the capital offense of grave robbing all hope was gone. But then the resurrected Jesus appeared saying, "Peace be with you" breathing on them saying, "Receive the Holy Spirit." This is the template for Lent. A season of 40 days where we allow Jesus to breathe on *us* and renew *our* Spirit. Lent is not about giving up something. It is not about losing weight. It is not about quitting smoking. It is about spiritual renewal. A reset if you will. A do over. It is a time that we allow Jesus to renew our walk with Him as He sends His Holy Spirit to help us grow closer to him. Let's not let this opportunity pass us by.
