

Two five-week courses are being offered through the University of Dayton's Virtual Learning Community for Faith Formation (VLCFF). These courses are hybrid models. They are composed of both weekly live two-hour zoom lectures as well as a rich variety of online course materials and discussion experiences through the University of Dayton's Virtual Learning Community For Faith Formation (VLCFF). The courses are being underwritten by the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston's Office of Evangelization & Catechesis, who pays 100% of the tuition and the cost of any books associated with the courses. <u>Christology</u>

This course is a deep dive into Jesus and assumes students have some familiarity with scripture already. We will hit the ground running with a look at how the Church has answered the question "Who do you say I am?" through the lens of theology. This course will enable students to learn and understand the foundations upon which all Christology rests, the theology developed from the apostolic age through the Council of Chalcedon in the fifth century A.D. We will discuss why the Church considers some ideas about Jesus heretical while others are not. We will gain a full understanding of how the Church understands who Jesus is and what he did, and the reasons why the Church holds this understanding.

The class opens the week of August 28th and we will have our first class meeting Monday August 28th at 7 pm Images of Jesus

Just starting to look to explore your faith or looking to learn more? This course is set at an introductory/intermediate level and is a good place to start for those seeking to move into adult faith formation.

Have you ever wanted to know more about Jesus? We are presented with many images of Jesus in the Gospels and throughout the New Testament. How have Christians come to understand the person of Jesus over the centuries? How are we to understand him today? Through this course participants will have the opportunity to examine, from a variety of theological perspectives, what we know and believe about the central figure of the Christian faith and arguably the most influential person who ever walked the earth. After looking at many different resources, the student will be able to form a personal answer to "Who do you say that I am?"

We will look at the images of Jesus in the New Testament, as understood in theology today, as understood in the Paschal Mystery and as encountered in the liturgical life of the Church. All course materials are online and the class opens the week of August 28th with our first class meeting Wednesday August 31st at 7 pm. This course is partially fulfills the requirements for the certificate in catechesis
